# PRO-FAB'S Production news

From the Desk of Ryan Russo

We would like to announce that to-date we have been awarded 2 of 5 contract awards we are bidding for the Lockheed Martin F35 JSF Program. This contract will account for an additional 35 million dollars of work from 2009 - 2013 bringing the award total to around \$70 million dollars in contracts. These same awards, when bounced off the original quote data, compile over 250,000 hours worth of manufacturing time. While we are confident that we will fair well on bid phases 3 - 5, which will be needed to reach our total target sales goals, we need to strive to perform and support all incoming purchase orders so we can maintain this work for the long term. In 2012 we will begin quoting for the full production contracts on the JSF program which we are being told will triple the current numbers.



- 1st award was 100% titanium and was for 67 part numbers totaling over 12,000 pieces to be shipped through 2013.
- 2nd award was primarily large aluminum components, i.e. RH & LH rear wing SPARs & Bulkheads totaling over 700 pieces to be shipped through 2013.

Any way you slice it we have our work cut out for us - "though as one team, with one goal we will succeed!"
